... At Christmastime 2005, **Diane Boyd** reached out to Cheryl for a project for her employer, Liberty Mutual. She has since donated hundreds of hours in many ways, including as a craft leader, and in assembling craft kits and helping with fundraisers.

"I've stayed because I love what we do. Cheryl and Elsie (Stroup, who has been a volunteer and leader almost since Cheryl founded Caitlin's Smiles) have become like family. My heart was forever changed when I met them, and I'll spend the rest of my life thanking them with my actions."



... **Cindy Drawbaugh** was assigned to us nearly 18 years ago through her work for a United Way Day of Caring. In addition to becoming a craft session leader, she has contributed to our fundraisers, picked up donations, assembled and quality-checked craft kits, and much more.

Perhaps Cindy's best contribution has been recruiting her mom, **Carrie Lewis,** in 2016. Carrie has become our quality-control expert supreme.

Every week, Carrie takes home a carload of craft kits. She spends "seven or eight hours" a day checking each one to make sure it's correct and complete. If it isn't, she gets the materials and makes it right.

... For **Becky Rusbatch,** it's a joy "just being a small cog in this really big wheel."

Becky joined us in 2019 via our volunteer application, and has quickly become one of our craft session leaders. That's in addition to serving as a receptionist and filling many other roles. The community's willingness to help amazes her.

"The other night, we had two high school athletes here," she says. "They were kids who didn't really need to be here. They could have been out doing just about anything else. But

they were here, stuffing beads into little bags."



... **Carol Koppenhaver** is our statistician. She not only fills Bags of Smiles and packs them for shipping, she keeps count of every Bag of Smiles, Coping Kit, craft kit, and toy that we send out and notes the medical facilities that receive them.

Carol learned of Caitlin's Smiles while working at the local law firm McNees, Wallace & Nurick as she typed paperwork for our application for charitable status. Her then-boss, attorney **Tim Finnerty**, now volunteers on our Board of Directors.

In addition to her many other contributions, she holds craft sessions at home for five former co-workers.

"We meet once a month on a Friday night," she says. "I feed them dinner, and then I make them put craft kits together for a couple hours."

... **Janet Krall** met Caitlin when she was Cheryl's retirement counselor with the state. It was pure coincidence that Kohl's assigned her to a volunteer team at Caitlin's Smiles.

"And then we came back here every month," Janet says. "It was because this was near and dear to my heart that my co-workers agreed to do that."

Janet still remains loyal to our mission, coming in every week for three hours, with Kohl's donating \$25 an hour. She says that will soon rise to \$50 an hour.
